IU Health North Hospital Gallery Walk in the Carmel Arts & Design District this Saturday

Carmel, IN – Wine and dine at one of the District restaurants, browse the new and exciting exhibits at the 10 District galleries and explore all the unique things the District has to offer during the Second Saturday IU Health North Hospital Gallery Walk on **Saturday**, **July 11**, **2015** from 5-9 p.m.

The Indiana Design Center (IDC) (200 S. Range Line Rd.) invites the public to kick-off its Gallery Walk experience from 5:30-7:30 pm. Convenient above and underground parking makes the IDC a great starting point for visitors to the Gallery Walk. Galleries and artists affiliated with the building will showcase their work, and participating showrooms will be open with artistic exhibits for guests to enjoy. The IDC will also host refreshments and entertainment that range from live music presented by The Warehouse to art activities for kids and opportunities to "meet the artist" or watch live artists paint in a pop-up gallery.

Inspire Studio & Gallery (111 W. Main St., Suite 120) will feature "Nature Revealed," a one-man show showcasing Rodney Reveal. The July Gallery Walk will offer a first look of his show and best selection prior to the opening taking place on July 18 from 6-9 p.m. during the Art of Wine.

The Carmel Arts Council Emerging Curator Program presents "Big Bad World: Conquering Fears of a Modern Society" by Carmel High School students Ally Russell and Ethan McAndrews at the World's Smallest Children's Art Gallery (40 W. Main St.)
